The Sailboat Church Begins Today

Today, Sunday, April 7, we begin "The Sailboat Church" study group at 9:00 am. These 45-minute sessions will help us define the direction God is leading our infant congregation. We need the faithful prayers and attendance of every person if we're going to be the successful Christ-sharers God has in mind.

Will You Buy a Pair of Shoes?

For the past several years, we have cut a children's size 5 shoe from blue jeans. The parts of the shoe are mailed to Uganda, where the women provide the labor to assemble the shoes and the children get shoes to prevent jiggers in their feet. During the month of April, we will be raising the funds to send these shoe parts to Uganda. Sole Hope no longer has their corporate sponsor, so we need to send \$35 per pair of shoes. The Mission Ministries team invites the congregation to support this project for a donation of \$17.50 for a single shoe, or \$35 for a pair of shoes. Write "Sole Hope" on the memo line on your check. We will have a board in the church showing our progress.
